

A BYLAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS THE ORKNEY CHURCH  
AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST.

WHEREAS Part III of The Heritage Property Act, 1980, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural and historical value or interest.

WHEREAS the Council of the Rural Municipality of Orkney No. 244 has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as:

"All that portion of the South West quarter of Section Nineteen (19) in Township Twenty-six (26) in Range Four (4) West of the Second Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan, in the Dominion of Canada, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the South West corner of said quarter section; thence Easterly along the South boundary of said quarter section a distance of One Hundred and Thirty-four (134) feet; thence Northerly and parallel with the West boundary of said quarter section a distance of Three Hundred and Thirty-seven (337) feet; thence Westerly and parallel to the said South boundary to a point in said West boundary; thence Southerly along the said West boundary to the place of commencement."

a Notice of Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in at least two issues of a newspaper with general circulation in the municipality with the first publication at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date of consideration of the bylaw and with the last publication at least seven (7) days prior to the date of that consideration;

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Secretary-Treasurer of the municipality;

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ORKNEY NO. 244, OF SASKATCHEWAN, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value of interest the real property known as:

"All that portion of the South West quarter of Section Nineteen (19) in Township Twenty-six (26) in Range Four (4) West of the Second Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan, in the Dominion of Canada, more particularly described as follows:


Commencing at the South West corner of said quarter section; thence Easterly along the South boundary of said quarter section a distance of One Hundred and Thirty-four (134) feet; thence Northerly and parallel with the West boundary of said quarter section a distance of Three Hundred and Thirty-seven (337) feet; thence Westerly and parallel to the said South boundary to a point in said West boundary; thence Southerly along the said West boundary to the place of commencement."

The significance of the site is as follows:

The Orkney Church was built in 1894 from field stone by the early settlers and pioneers from the Orkney Isles, Scotland.

2. That the Secretary-Treasurer cause to be registered a certified copy of this bylaw against the said property described above in the proper Land Titles Office.


3. The Secretary-Treasurer is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this bylaw to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Minister of Culture and Youth, and to cause notice of the passing of this bylaw.


