Rural Municipality of Orkney No. 244

BYLAW NO 12/2016

GENERAL OFFENCE AND PENALTY BYLAW

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Orkney No. 244, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. This Bylaw may be referred to as the General Penalty Bylaw.

General Offence and penalty

- 2. Any person who contravenes any provision of any bylaw of the municipality for which no other penalty is specifically provided is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction:
 - a. A) in the case of an individual who is convicted of:
 - i. a first offence, to a fine of not more than \$1,000.00;
 - ii. a second offence, to a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months, or to both such fine and imprisonment;
 - iii. a third subsequent offence, to a fine of not more than \$10,000.00 to imprisonment for a term of not more than one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment;
 - b. in the case of a corporation that is convicted of:
 - i. a first offence, to a fine of not more than \$5,000.00;
 - ii. a second offence, to a fine of not more than \$10,000.00;
 - iii. a third or subsequent offence, to a fine of not more than \$25,000.00.

Liability of directors and officers of corporations

Where an offence is committed by a corporation, the directors or officers of the corporation who directed, authorized, assented to, acquiesced in or participated in the commission of the offence are guilty of the offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties mentioned in clause 3(a) whether or not the corporation has been convicted.

Continuing offences

4. Where an offence is a continuing offence, the maximum daily fine is \$2,500.00.
